Questions

Nightfall, Darkness After the Final “Sonset”

- 1) What “keywords” might algorithms use to search for and erase rapture warnings and explanations from the internet after our departure?
- 2) With our new understanding of AI capabilities, how it can already generate “sermons” and explain Bible content, what is the likelihood that truth will be replaced with deception online rather than all content being deleted as we have previously assumed?
- 3) With both of the above in mind, why is having written, spiritual materials in your home critical for the spread of the Gospel and the growth of tribulation saints?

Are They Worth It?

Agreed, not everyone who will enter our post-rapture homes will be or ever become a lamb. Some may shake their fists and curse God up until they land in the perpetual lake of fire.

- 1) Since we can’t know who will enter our homes, is it worth making physical and spiritual preparations even though we may be feeding the “worst” criminal? How humbling to know that the Lord saved all of us who were also at one time the worst of criminals. Read 1 Timothy 1:15-16 aloud and discuss.
- 2) Do you think that prayer now, asking for your home to become a feeding ground for dozens of new baby Christians, is beneficial? How might Matthew 9:37-38 speak to our labors now for the great harvest then?
- 3) Do you ever pray while you’re making these preparations? A beautiful prayer to pray for those who will and all the ones who won’t enter our homes is found in Acts 26:18, words spoken by Jesus to Saul.

Actions and Reactions

Will various groups of desperate people pass through my home while on the run from the global dictator, or will an individual or family land here and stay? I don't know. What I do know is that I want to feed whoever shows up here more than beef ravioli. I want to help them ingest the Word.

- 1) How might your actions now of physically and spiritually preparing to feed an unbeliever lead to them becoming an eventual believer in Jesus?
- 2) What kinds of spiritual food are you leaving in your home, such as letters, note cards with verses, Bibles, warnings, etc...?
- 3) How might you simplify our churchy terminology for those who have no experience with a Bible and teach as if to a 10-year-old?
- 4) Do you feel inadequate and unqualified to write and explain what is going on to the left behind even though you understand it? Does using an online version of a left behind letter help?
- 5) Have you expressed your personal story and history with Jesus in a letter? How might your story help someone else know Jesus better?

Bonus:

If your group finishes the questions early and you find you have extra time on your hands, below are a few discussion topics that might ignite conversation if you need help:

- How long have you been a rapture watcher? Who first told you about the rapture?
- What is something interesting you've watched or read recently about the rapture or last days? What was the topic and what did you learn?
- Share some ways you have found to cope with fears and anxiety while waiting on the rapture.
- Who is your greatest means of support through all the craziness of this world? Name names and share how they are there for you.
- Do you get more excited around the time of the fall feasts or other times of the year?
- Come up with your own conversation starter based on current headlines.
